Students need to submit a cover sheet with their name, age, teacher, parents' permission to publish and read, as well as a second sheet with the essay (no more than 250 words, excluding the title). The prize: state and local school recognition, publication in *Raymond Voter Information Project 2012*, and opportunities to read essays on local Raymond Community Television. "Most of all, the winner will know that someone who might not have voted, or might not have voted fully informed, did so inspired by the winning essay," says Raymond VIP President Gretchen Gott.

Entries must be postmarked no later than November 22 to Raymond VIP, Box 813, Raymond NH 03077. Members of the Raymond Voter Information Project come from a broad range of careers and municipal experience, and have many personal viewpoints. However, within Raymond VIP, they are committed to neither support nor oppose any political party, candidate or warrant article and to focus on providing objective voter information.
